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Rites of Hajj

Before we begin, let's briefly understand the four parts of Hajj.
As any act of worship, we have the following (and for Hajj “types”):

Types of Hajj

There are three types of Hajj a pilgrim can perform :

Definition:

Performing Umrah first, then coming out of ihram, and then entering into ihram again for Hajj on 8th Dhul-Hijjah.

Process:

Enter ihram for Umrah → Complete Umrah → Exit ihram → Enter ihram again for Hajj on 8th Dhul-Hijjah → Complete Hajj

Requirement:

A sacrifice (Hadi) is required with this type of Hajj.

Note: The Prophet ﷺ recommended and encouraged his companions to perform this type of Hajj.

1. Hajj Tamattu'

Tamattu (التمتع) means
enjoyment or benefit.



2. Hajj Qiran

Qiran (قِران) means to combine or join.

Definition:

Performing Umrah and Hajj together with a single ihram.

Intention: لَبَّيْكَ اللَّهُمَّ عُمْرَةً وَحَجًّا ل Labbayk Allahumma 'umratan wa ḥajjan; *Here I am with a Hajj & Umrah.*

Process:

Enter ihram for both Umrah and Hajj → Come to Makkah → Remain in ihram → Complete Hajj (tawaf and saee counts for Umrah as well)

Requirement:

A sacrifice (Hadi) is required with this type of Hajj.

3. Hajj Ifrad

Ifrad (إفراد) means means to make something single.

Definition:

Performing only Hajj without Umrah.

Process:

Enter ihram for Hajj only → Complete Hajj → Exit ihram

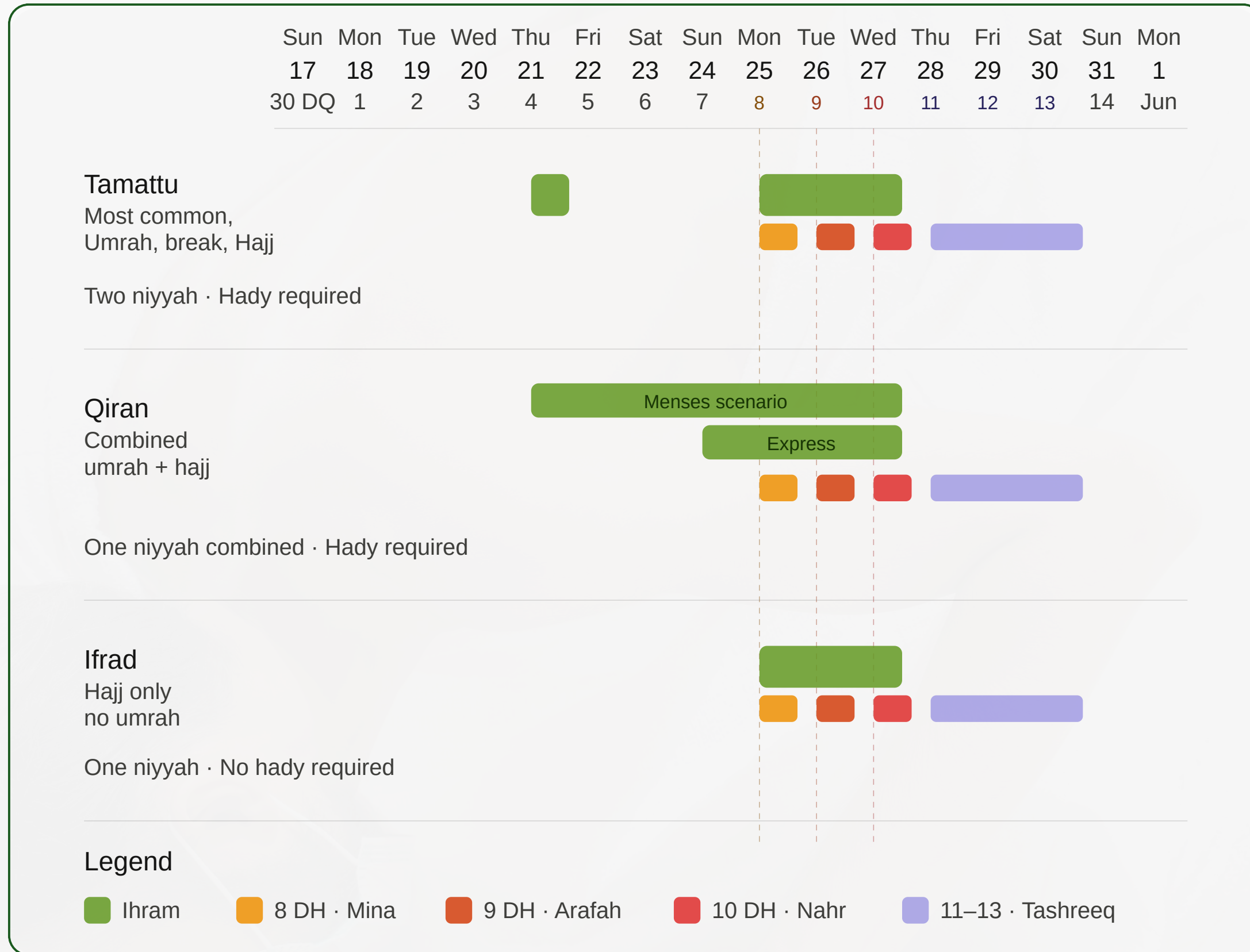
Requirement:

No sacrifice is required for this type of Hajj.

These slides are focusing on the Hajj portion of the Hajj Tamattu'.

Pillars of Hajj

These are the acts you absolutely cannot miss (arkān or pillars).
Until we complete them, the Hajj is incomplete.

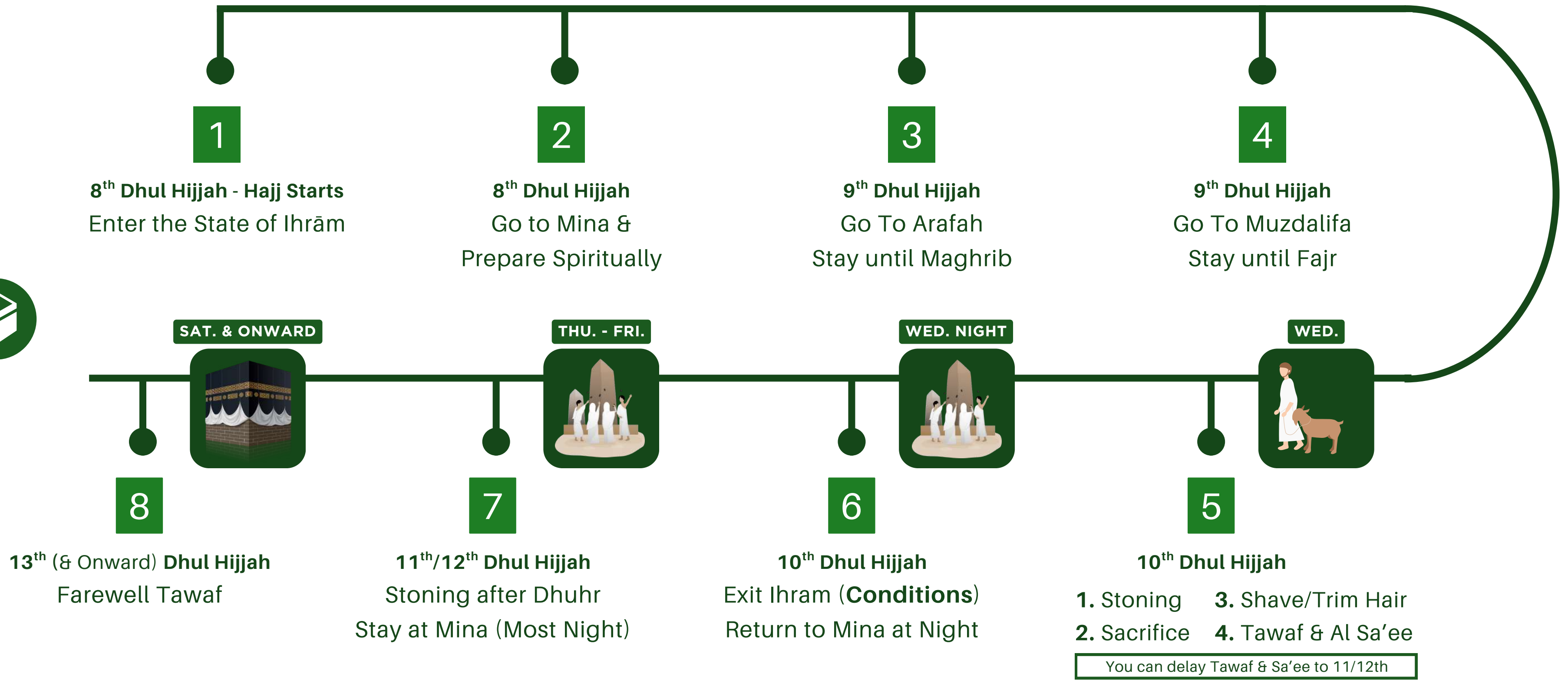

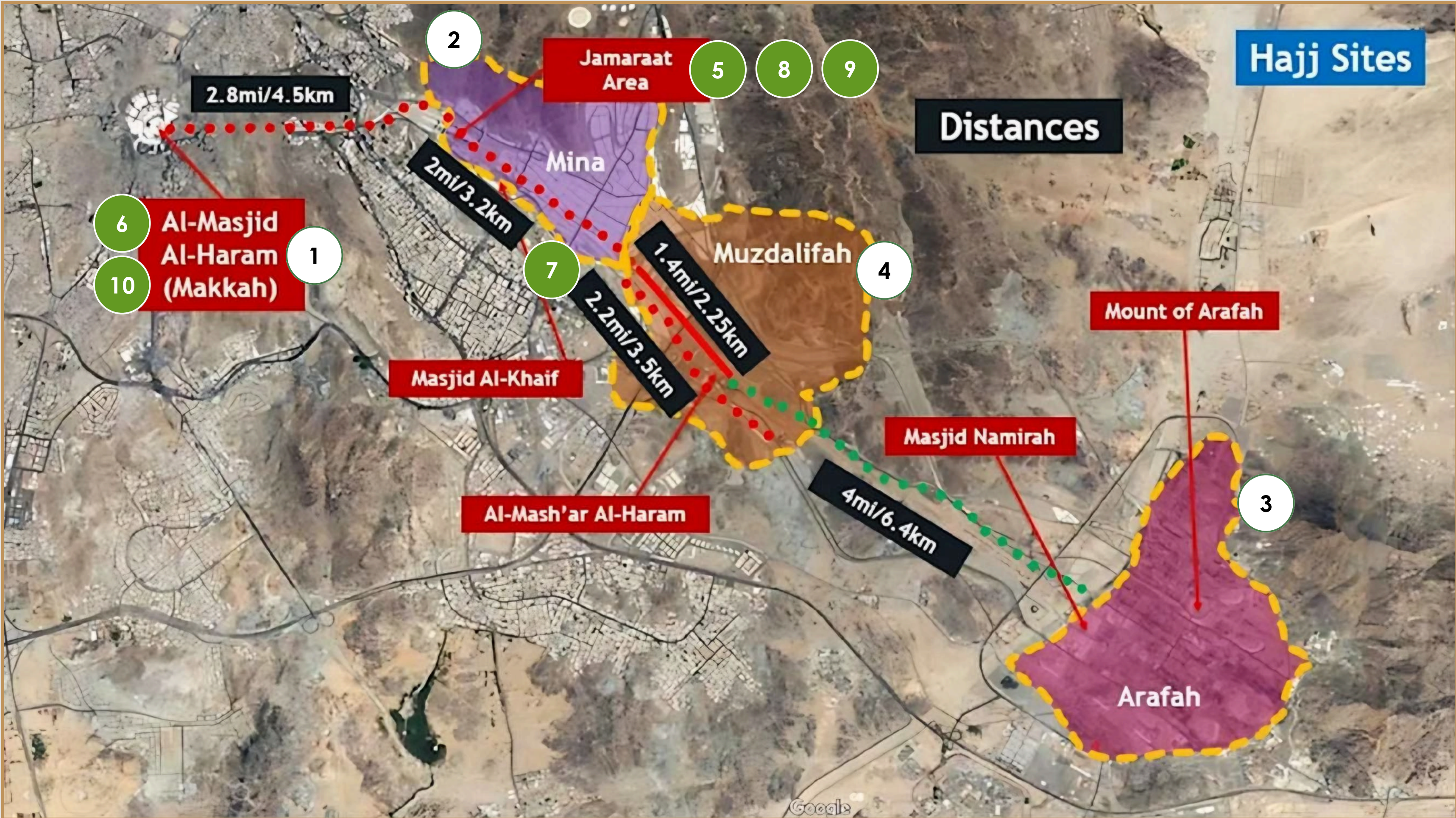

Day 1: 8th Dhul-Hijjah (Yawm at-Tarwiyah)

- The Hajj starts on this day. You will make the intention and go to Mina.

Enter Ihram for Hajj:

- Take a shower
- Put on ihram clothes like you did when you performed your Umrah.
- You need to enter the state of Ihram and begin the process of Hajj.
 - You do not need to go to any special Miqat station. We will do this in our rooms.
- Make intention for Hajj, saying:
 - Labbaika-Allaahumma Hajj - **لَبَّيْكَ اللَّهُمَّ حَجًّا**
 - Translation: Here I am, O Allah, in response to your call, making Hajj!
- Recite the Talbiyah
 - Labbayk Allahumma Labbayk, Labbayk La sharika Laka Labbayk, Innal hamda wanni'mata Laka walmulk La sharika Lak.
 - **لَبَّيْكَ اللَّهُمَّ لَبَّيْكَ، لَبَّيْكَ لَا شَرِيكَ لَكَ لَبَّيْكَ، إِنَّ الْحَمْدَ وَالنُّعْمَةَ لَكَ وَالْمُلْكَ، لَا شَرِيكَ لَكَ**
 - You will continue to recite until you throw the Jamarāt (stoning) on the Eid day.

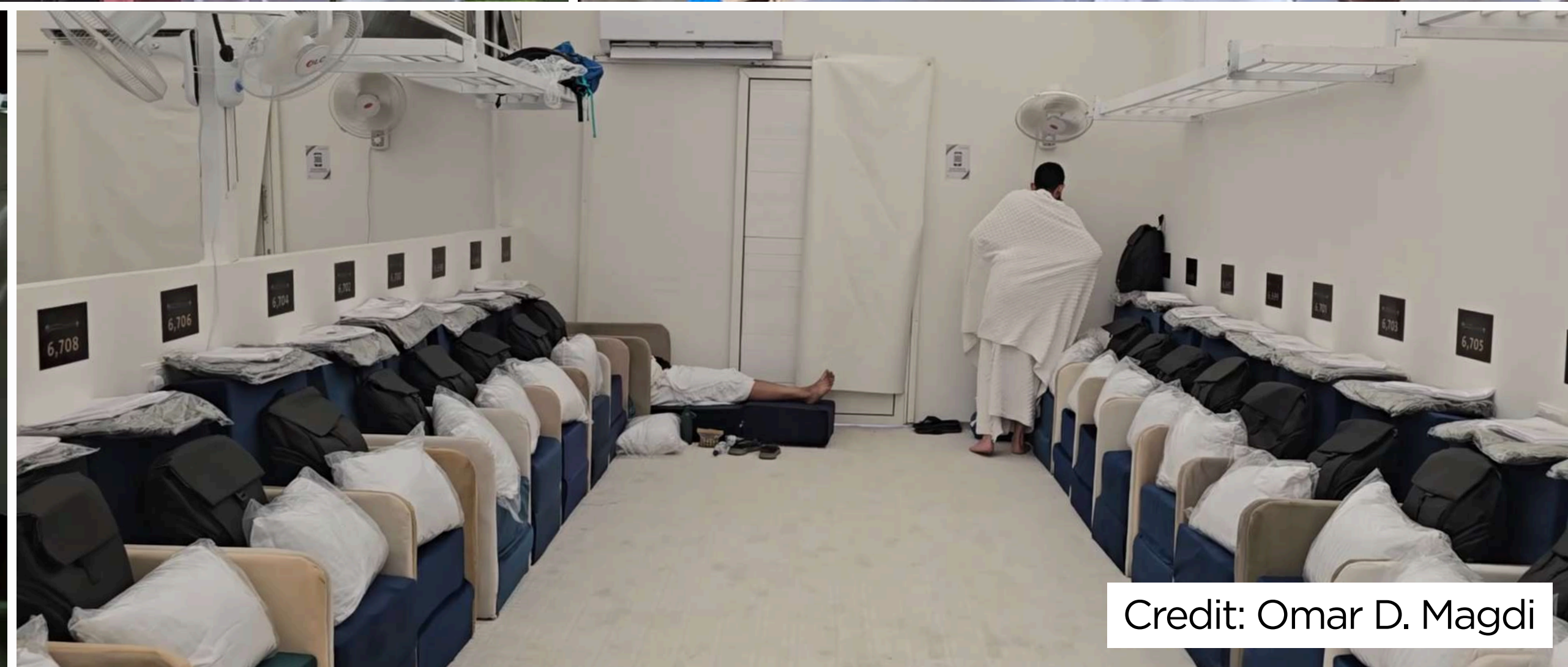
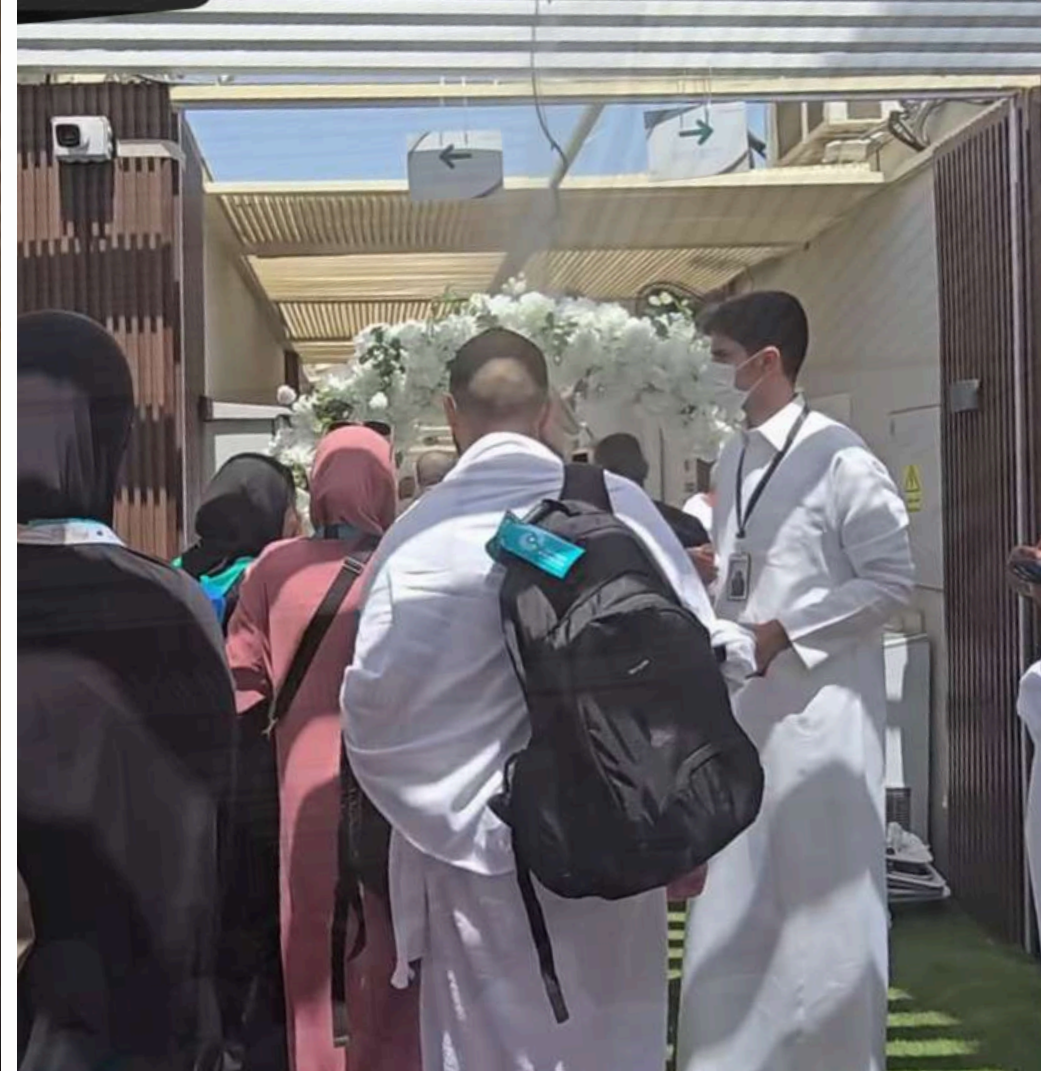


- Make the same condition for emergencies as we did for Umrah:
 - Allaahumma mahillee haithu habastanee - **اللَّهُمَّ مَجِّئِي حَيْثُ حَبَسْتَنِي**
 - O Allah, allow me to get out of the state of 'Ihram wherever You prevent me.
- Also, say this dua:
 - Allahumma haathihee Hajjatun La-Riyaa' feehaa walaa summ'a
 - **اللَّهُمَّ هَذِهِ حَجَّةٌ لَا رِيَاءَ فِيهَا وَلَا سُمْعَةَ**
 - O Allah, this is a Hajj in which there is no showing off nor seeking reputation.

Proceed to Mina:

- Then we will go to Mina, get settled, and we will stay here the night.
- We will pray our prayers at Mina.
 - We will **shorten** the prayers, but **not combine them**.
- Engage in reciting the Quran, dhikr, and making dua'. There is no special dua'.
- Continue reciting the Talbiyah frequently.

Practical Tip: Take time to know your tent location and become familiar with your surroundings in Mina. Note your tent number and Google/Apple map location pin.



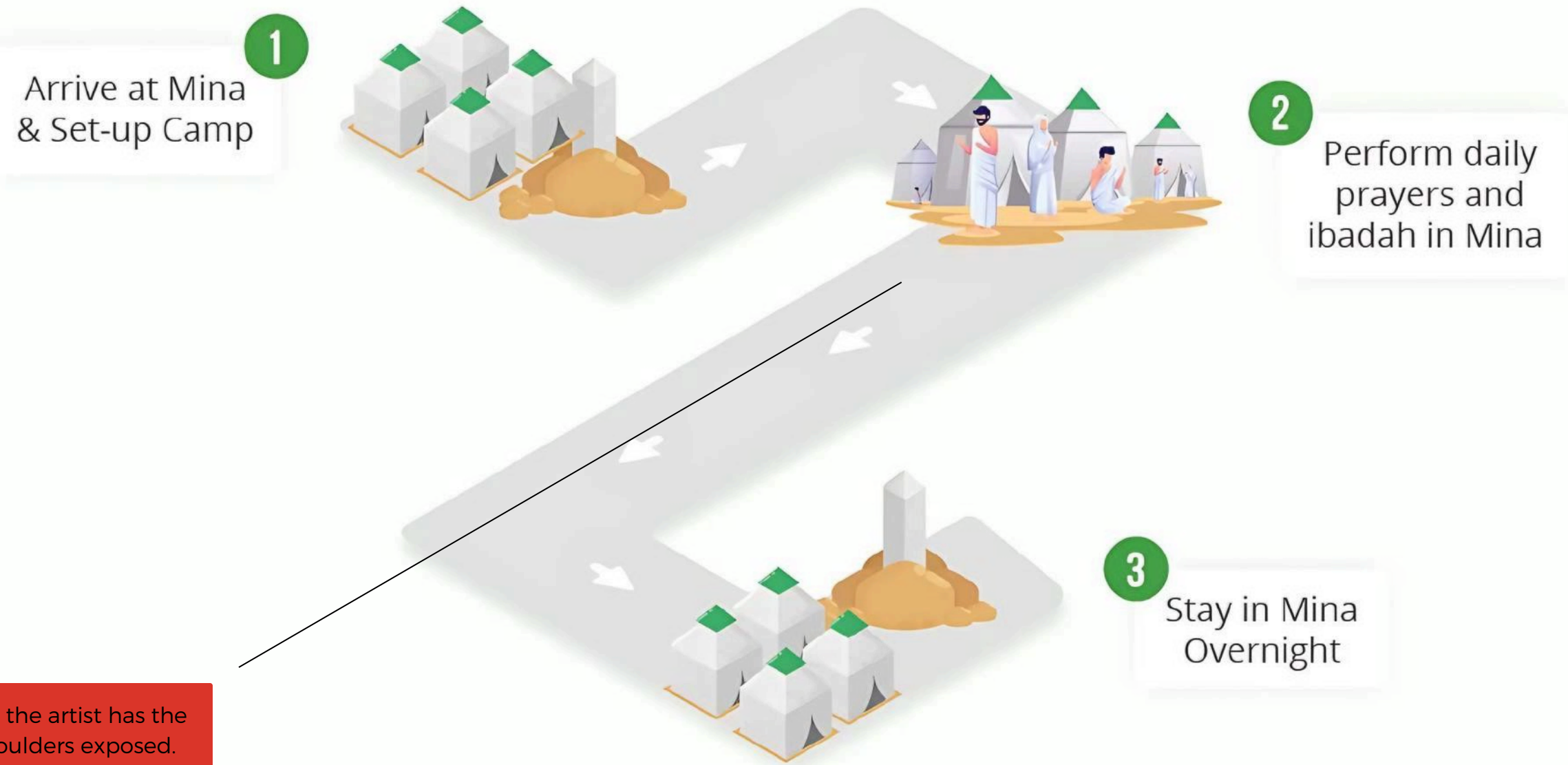

Day 2: 9th Dhul-Hijjah (Yawmu Arafah)

- This is a **pillar** of Hajj! There is no fidya or sacrifice that can make up for missing Arafah.
- You will leave for 'Arafah from Mina after Fajr prayer and stay until Maghrib.
- There is no fasting for those who are performing Hajj.

Leave Mina for 'Arafat

- Pilgrims leave Mina after praying Fajr (bus schedule can delay this)
- Continue reciting Talbiyah

Arriving at 'Arafat:

- After arriving at 'Arafat, you should rest until noon, as is the sunnah
- Pray combined and shortened Dhuhr and Asr at Dhuhr time
- You will stay in 'Arafat until sunset

Rites at 'Arafah:

- Spend your time reciting Qur'an, seeking forgiveness, and supplicating (dua) to Allah
- **This is the most important pillar of Hajj.**

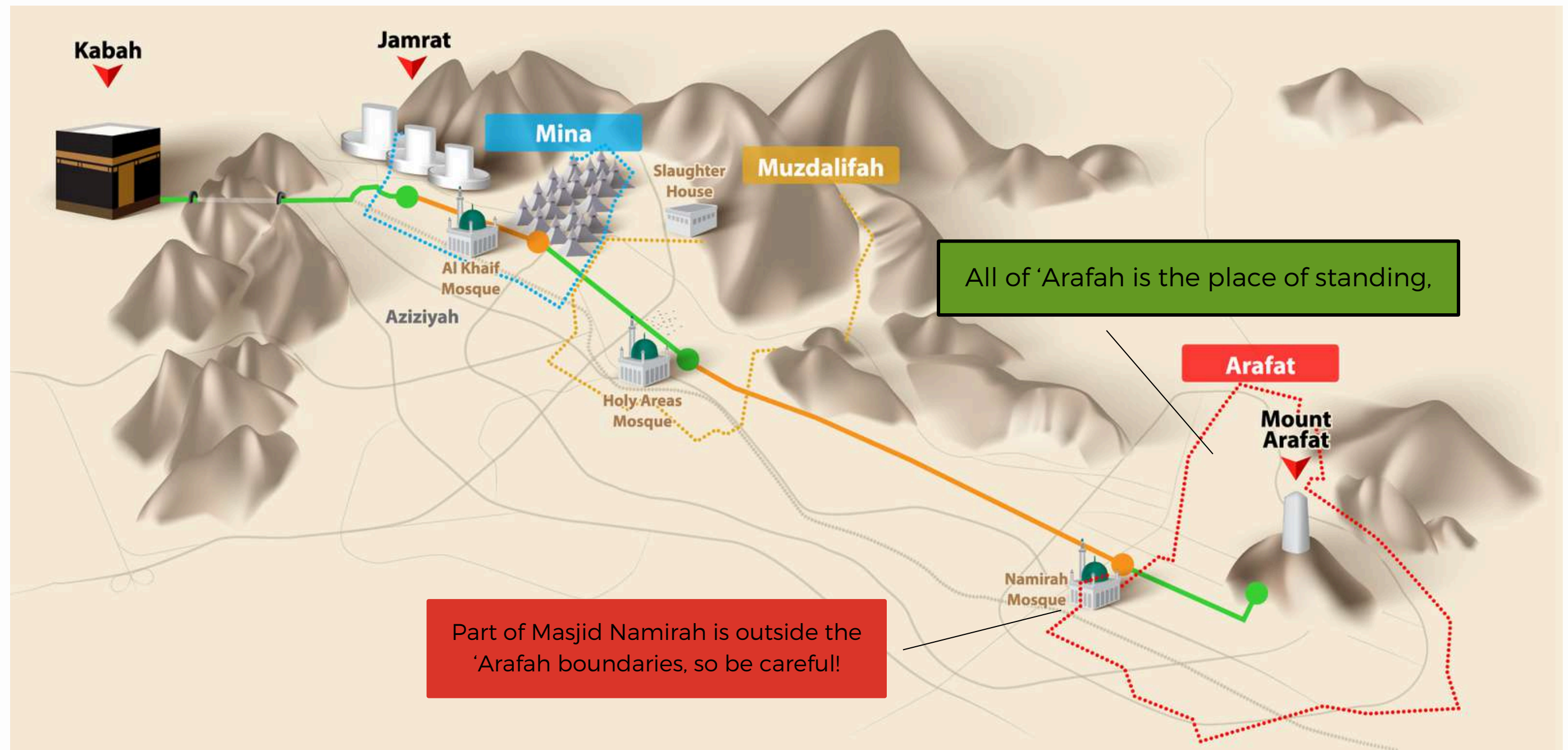

Rites at 'Arafah: The most important pillar of Hajj

- **Important:** You do not need to go to the Mount of Mercy (Jabal ur-Rahmah) or Masjid Nimrah (al-Namirah). **All of Arafah is a place of standing.**

Rites at 'Arafah: This is the most important pillar of Hajj

- Etiquette of making dua and adhkar:
 - Face the Qiblah, raise your hands in dua, and recite Talbiyah.
 - Recite frequently: 'La ilaha illaAllaah' as it is the best duaa' on the day of 'Arafah.

- Prophet ﷺ said: **The best thing that I and the Prophets have said on the day of 'Arafah is:**

لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ وَحْدَهُ لَا شَرِيكَ لَهُ، لَهُ الْمُلْكُ، وَلَهُ الْحَمْدُ، وَهُوَ عَلَى كُلِّ شَيْءٍ قَدِيرٌ

La ilaha illaAllaah, wahdahu laa shareeka lahu lahul mulk wa lahul hamdu wa huwa
'alaa kulli shay'in qadeer

There is no deity worthy of worship except Allah alone; He has no partner. Sovereignty is His, and He has the ability over all things.

- **Duration:** You must stay in 'Arafah **until Maghrib** azan. Then head to Muzadlifah.

Please Note: Some groups would start gathering right before Maghrib and start walking towards either the train station or the bus stop. That is okay, as long as they are still inside the boundary of 'Arafah.

Continuing - Day 2: 9th Dhul-Hijjah (Night of Muzdalifa)

Quick Summary:

- You will arrive in Muzdalifa after Maghrib, closer to Isha, or later.
- You will stay in Muzdalifa until Fajr; thereafter, walk to Mina, then to Jamarāt.
- *The elderly, women, and those accompanying them may leave early - read more.*
- This is also a good opportunity to pick up the stones (chickpea size).

Arriving at Muzdalifah:

- Pray Maghrib & 'Ishaa (shortened and combined):
 - When you reach Muzdalifah, give Athan and Iqaamah.
 - Then pray the three ra'kahs of Maghrib.
 - Then give iqaamah and pray 'Ishaa – shortening it, combining the two prayers.
- The only other prayer the Prophet ﷺ did on this night is the Witr prayer.
- All of Muzdalifah is a place of standing, so wherever you stand, it is permissible.

Rest for Tomorrow:

- If possible, sleep until Fajr so you can get some rest for a BIG day ahead.

Pick up stones from Muzdalifah:

- Collect pebbles for stoning
 - 49 total: 7 for the first day, 21 each for the second and third days
- Pebbles should be small (chickpea-sized, about 1 cm)

Fajr at Muzdalifah:

- Pray Fajr in the early part of its time.
 - As soon as Fajr time comes, make Athan and Iqaamah, and pray Fajr in the first part of its time.
- All of the pilgrims should pray the Fajr prayer in Muzdalifah **except**:
 - The weak and the women – it is permissible for them to leave after half of the night has passed, for fear of the crowd of people.
- Sunnah Note: After praying Fajr at Muzdalifah, the Prophet ﷺ rode his camel Qaswa until he came to al-Mash'ar al-Haram. He faced the Qiblah, made du'a, said takbir, tahlil, and affirmed Allah's oneness (tawhid), and continued standing until the sky became very bright (well-lit), and then he departed before sunrise.

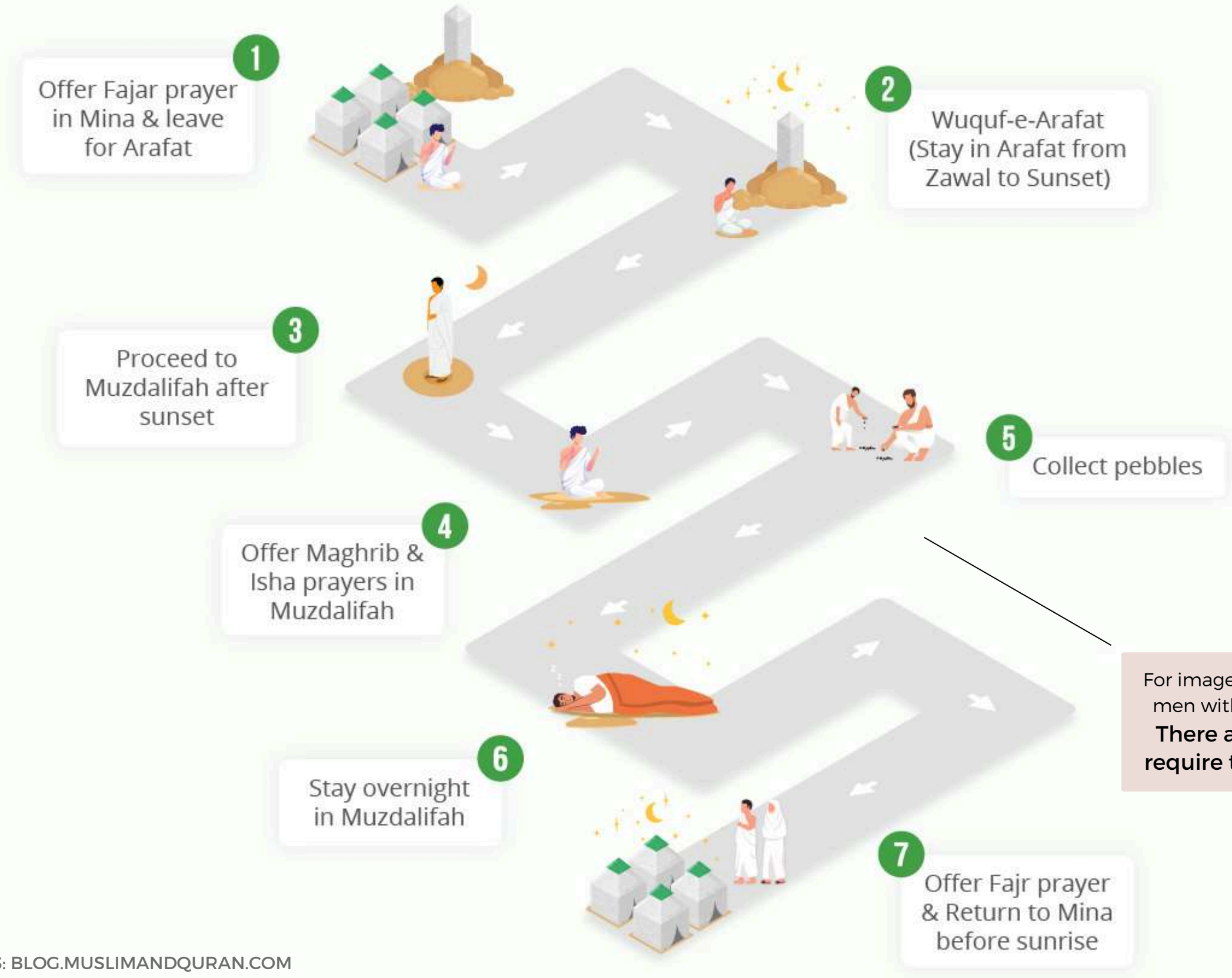
Muzdalifah is an open area with limited facilities. **Be prepared for basic conditions.**

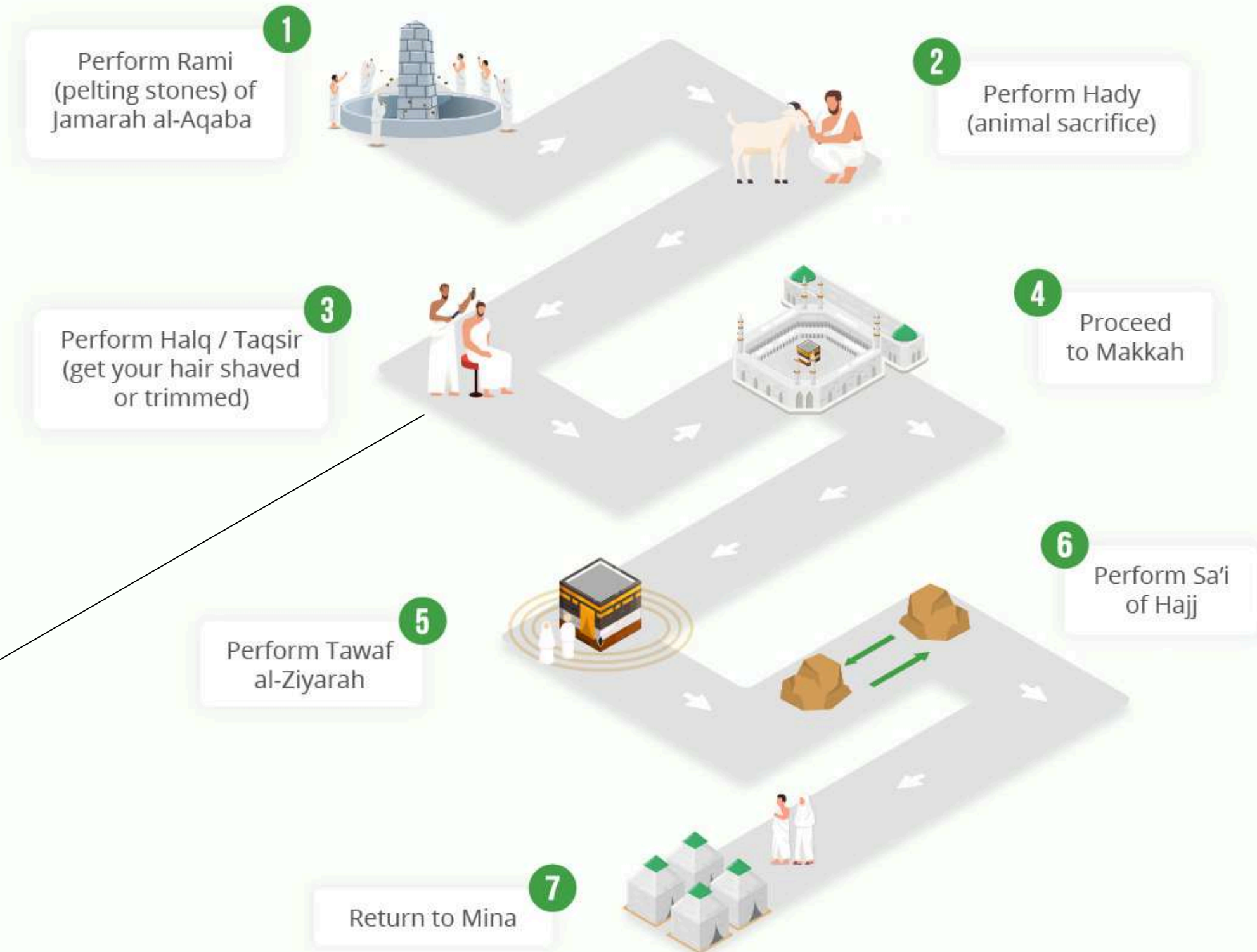

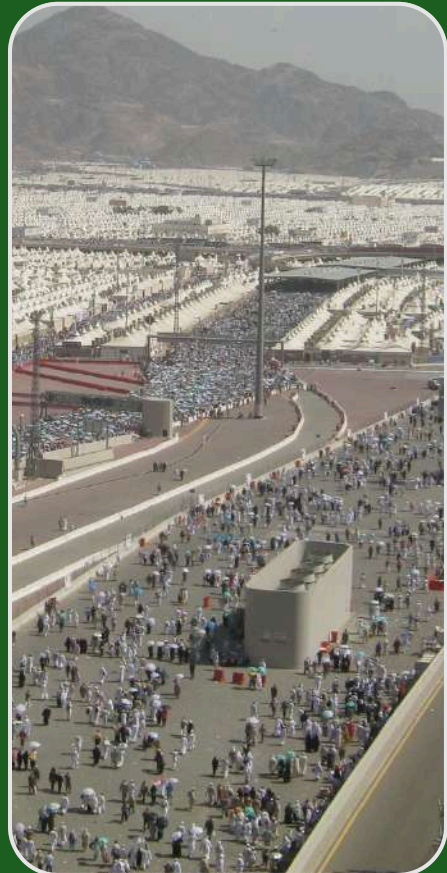

Day 3: 10th Dhul-Hijjah (Yaumul-Nahr / Day of Sacrifice / Eid)

- On this day, you will perform four acts of worship. The rites are:

- **The order is preferred but not essential.**

1. Stone Jamarāh-al-Aqaba (Ramy)
2. Sacrifice an animal (Hady)
3. Shave/trim your hair (Halq/Taqsir)
4. Tawaf al-i'fadah and Al-sa'ee

- After completing **any three**, you exit the minor state of ihram (hill al-asghar).
 - Almost all the ihram restrictions are lifted. The only restriction left is marital relations.
- After completing **all four**, you exit ihram completely (hill al-akbar / complete hill).

Proceed to Jamarāt from Muzdalifa:

- After Fajr, the Muzdalifa rites are complete. Next are the four rites of the Day of Eid.
 - You can go to Jamarāt directly if you wish and then continue down the list.
 - You can also stop at your camp first if you'd like to rest for a few hours.
 - Depending on your mode of travel, train, bus or walking, your options will differ.
- Once you arrive at the Jamarāt structure, proceed to the throwing area.

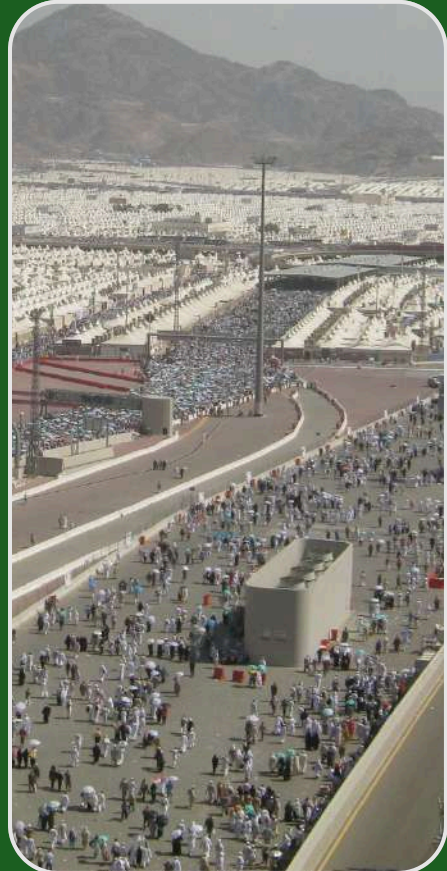

1. Stone [Only] Jamarat al-Aqabah:

- Pick up stones from Mina or Jamarat if you did not do so in Muzdalifah.
- Stone only Jamarat al-Aqabah/Al-Kubraa (the largest pillar, closest to Makkah).
- Throw seven pebbles one by one:
 - Etiquette: **1. say takbeer**, "Allahu Akbar," and **2. then throw**. (repeat 7 times)
- Stop reciting Talbiyah after throwing the last stone and start the **Takbeer of Eid**.

اللَّهُ أَكْبَرُ، اللَّهُ أَكْبَرُ، لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ، وَاللَّهُ أَكْبَرُ، اللَّهُ أَكْبَرُ، وَلِلَّهِ الْحَمْدُ

Allāhu Akbar, Allāhu Akbar, lā ilāha illā Allāh, wa-Allāhu Akbar, Allāhu Akbar, wa lillāhi al-ḥamd
Allah is the Greatest, Allah is the Greatest, there is no god but Allah, and Allah is the Greatest,
Allah is the Greatest, and to Allah belongs all praise.

Extended part as per sunnah: اللَّهُ أَكْبَرُ كَبِيرًا، وَالْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ كَثِيرًا، وَسُبْحَانَ اللَّهِ بُكْرَةً وَأَصِيلًا

Allāhu Akbar kabīran, wa al-ḥamdu lillāhi kathīran, wa subḥān Allāhi bukratan wa aṣīlā
Allah is the Greatest, immensely Great. All praise is for Allah, abundantly. Glory be to Allah, morning and evening.

- The stoning can be done anytime after Fajr, up to Maghrib if needed, due to the crowd.

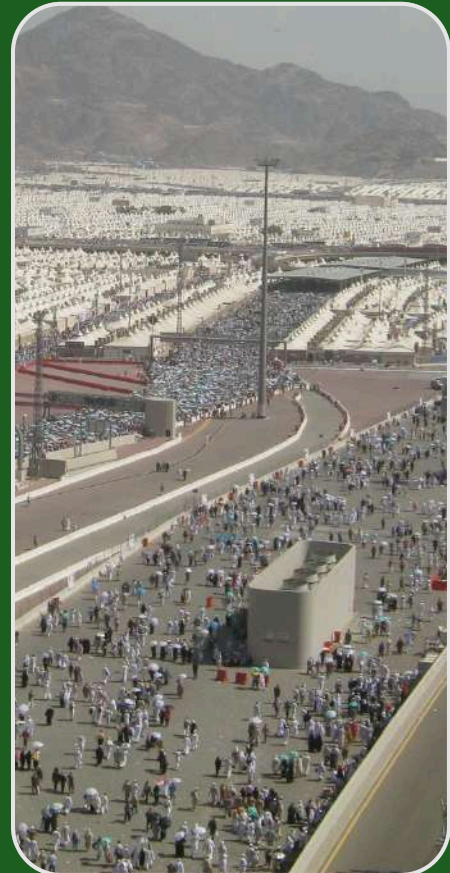

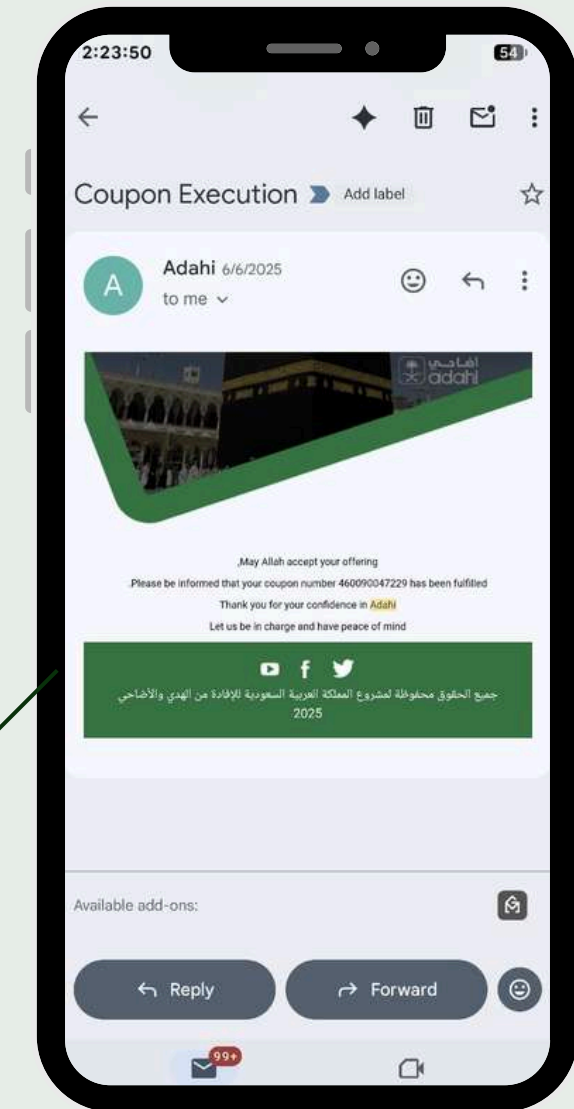
2. Sacrifice an Animal:

- Most pilgrims will not perform the sacrifice themselves; we have appointed a proxy to do so on our behalf.
- For most of us, this is already secured through **Nusuk** when purchasing the hajj package.
 - If not, go to adahi.org and purchase a **hady voucher**.
- Now, with many of these services, you'll get a confirmation email informing you that the sacrifice has been made.

The confirmation email from adahi.org.

3. Shave or Cut Hair

- Men: Shave head completely (preferred) or cut hair shorter.
- Women: Cut a fingertip's length from the ends of their hair.

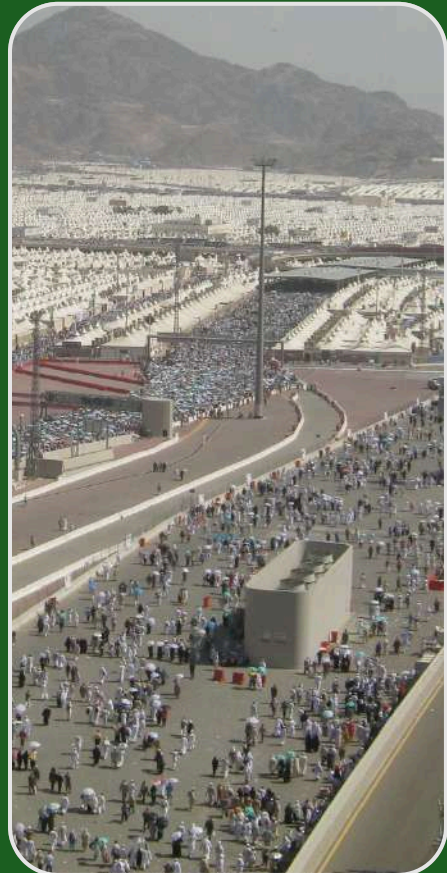

4. Tawaf and Sa'ee of Hajj (Tawaf al-i'fadah and Al-sa'ee)

- This is another pillar of Hajj, similar to 'Arafah, **that cannot be missed or rectified.**
- Go to Makkah and perform seven rounds around the Ka'bah (similar to Umrah)
 - **Click here** to access the **Umrah One-Pager** (skip to the dua to enter the mosque)
- The only difference in the Tawaf al-i'fadah is that there is **NO**:
 - **Idtibaa'** (uncovering the right shoulder) or **Raml** (brisk walking) during tawaf.
- Pray two rakahs behind Maqam Ibrahim and drink from Zam Zam.
- Perform Sa'ee between Safaa and Marwah as explained in the umrah.
- Tawaf al-Ifadah can be delayed to the 11th or 12th Dhul Hijjah to avoid extreme crowds. However, the crowds are the lightest on the Day of Eid (10th Dhul Hijjah). 

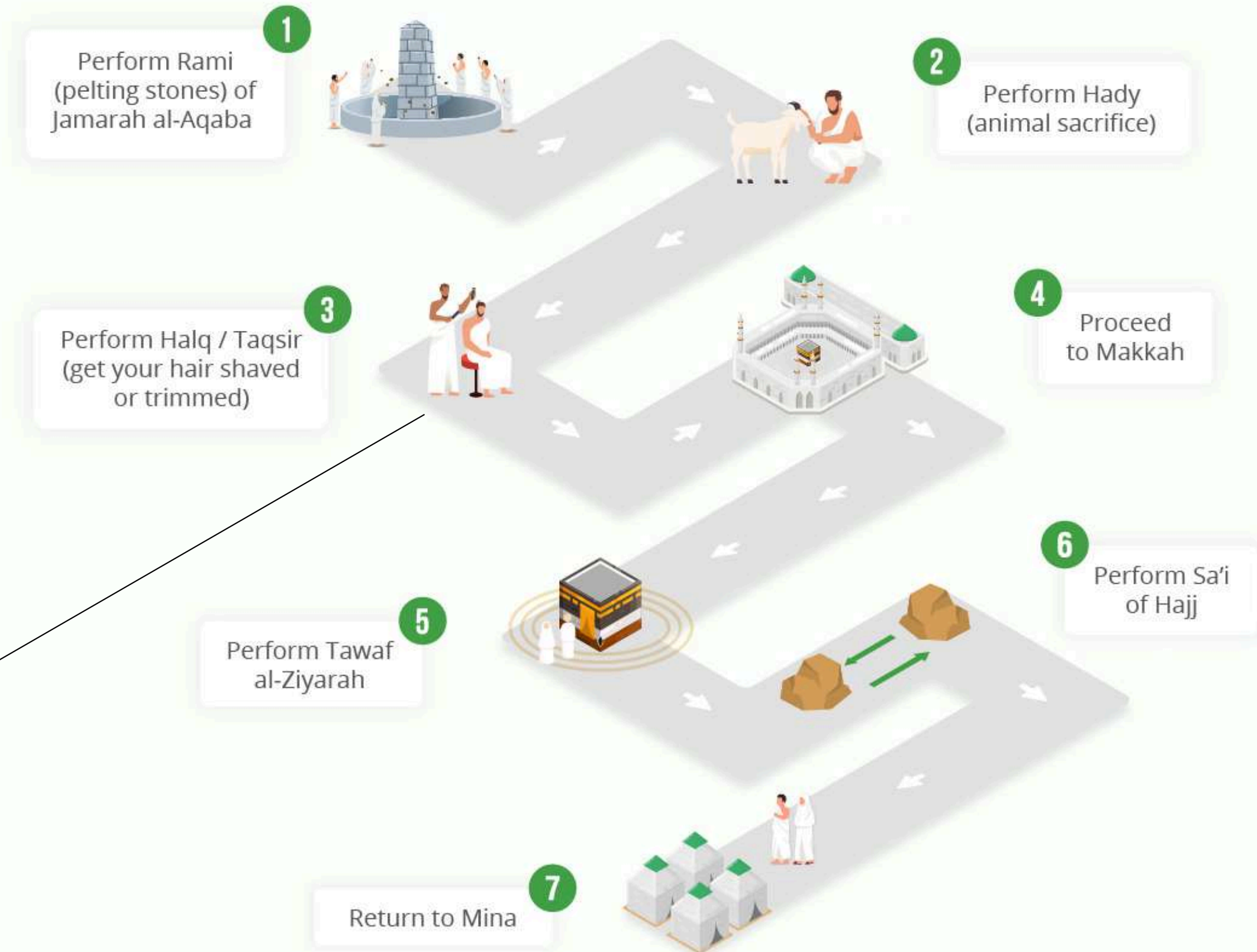
Performing any three of these four acts puts you in the state of minor release (hill al-asghar). Again, the order is preferred, not essential.

Important: Remember to return to Mina's tents before midnight.

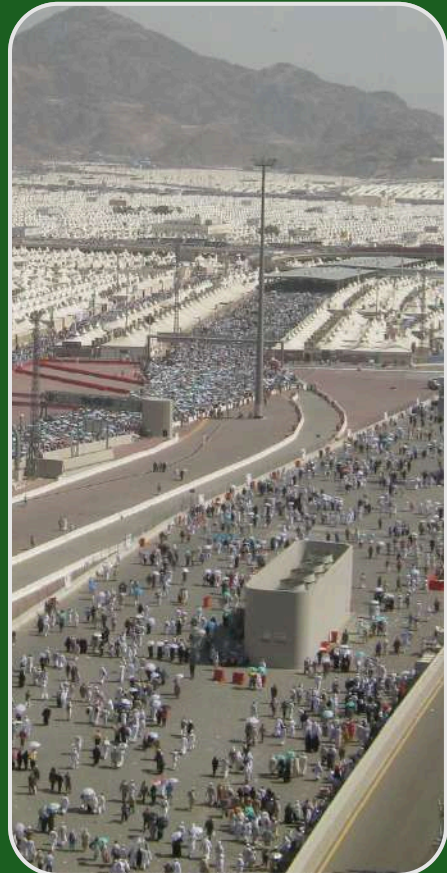

Day 4: 11th Dhul-Hijjah (Ayamū-Tashreeq / Days of Tashreeq)

- You must spend most of the nights (more than half of the night) of 11th and 12th Dhul Hijjah in Mina.
- On 12 Dhul Hijjah, you may either leave Mina before Maghrib or stay for the night and stone again on 13 Dhul Hijjah.
- Stone all three jamarāt each day after Dhuhr (after the sun has passed its zenith), in order: Sughra → Wusta → Aqabah, with 7 pebbles each.

Stone all three Jamarāt

- Start with the small Jamrah (al-Sughra), throw seven pebbles with takbeer.
 - Etiquette: **1. say takbeer**, "Allahu Akbar," and **2. then throw.** (repeat 7 times)
 - Then: **Move forward, face the Qiblah, and make a du'a.**
- Proceed to stone the middle Jamrah (al-Wusta); seven pebbles with takbeer.
 - Move forward, face the Qiblah, and make a du'a.
- Stone Jamrah al-Aqabah; seven pebbles with takbeer.
 - You return to Mina as there is **no dua after the last Jamarah.**

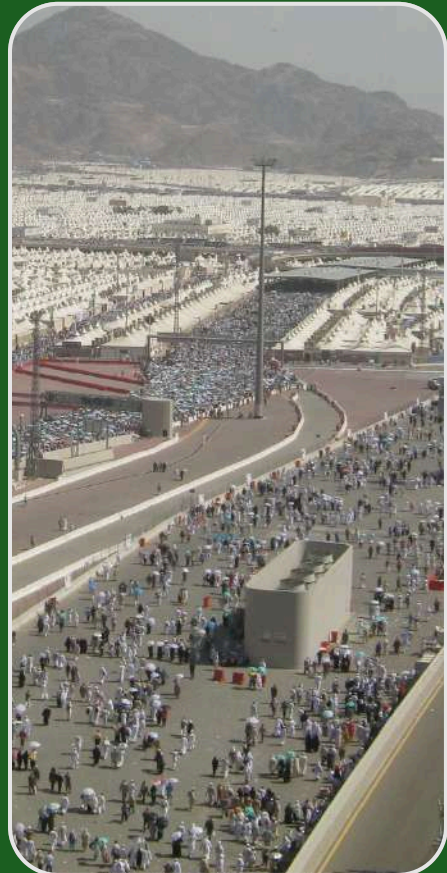

Day 5: 12th Dhul-Hijjah (Ayamu-Tashreeq / Days of Tashreeq)

- Repeat the same stoning procedure as was done on the 11th Dhul-Hijjah (last slide).
- If you leave after stoning on the second day (today), then that is permissible.
 - However, remaining for the third day is also permissible, if your itinerary allows.
- If you want to leave after the second day, you need to depart Mina's borders before Maghrib.
- It is lawful to visit the Ka'bah and make tawaaf during each of the nights of Mina as the Prophet ﷺ did so. As long as you stay more than half of the night at Mina.

If leaving Mina on the 12th Dhul Hijjah:

- Depart after stoning on the 12th **before Maghrib**.
- Otherwise, you will have to stay for the 13th day and stone the Jamarāt again.

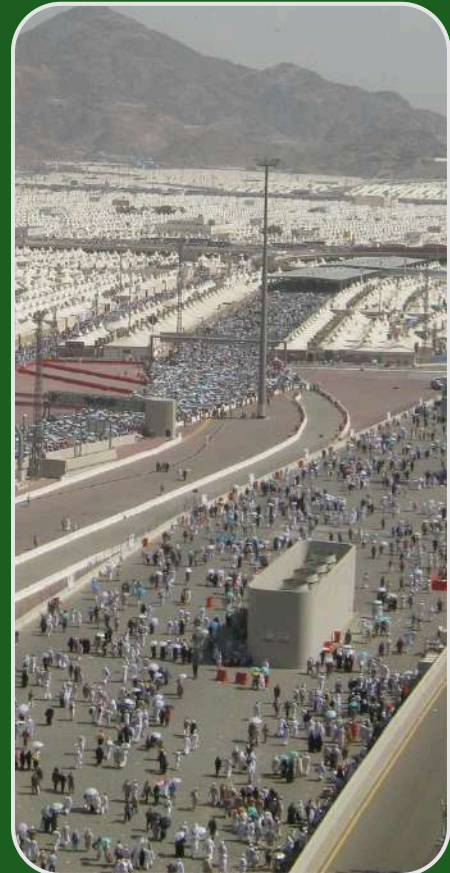


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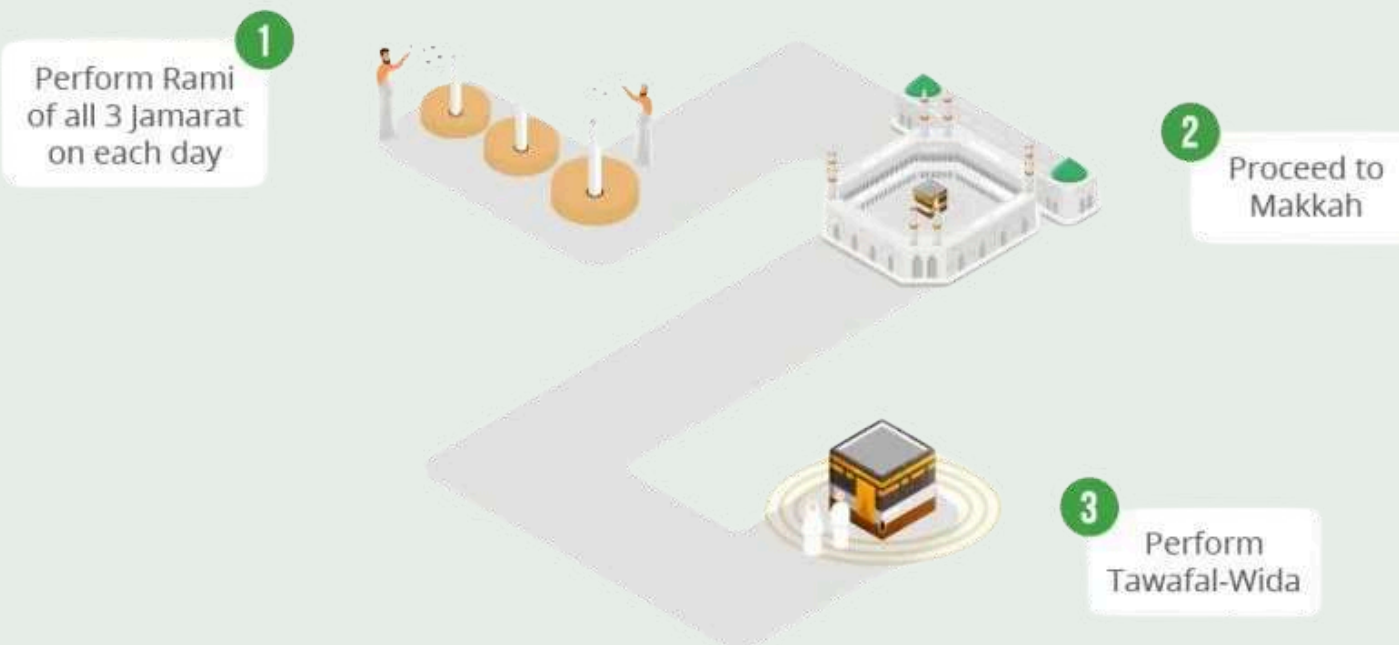

- You can depart anytime after stoning.

Final Step: Farewell Tawāf (Tawāf al-Wada')

- After you have completed all of your Hajj obligations and when you are ready to leave Makkah, we will perform **Tawāf al-Wada'**:
 - **This should be your last rite act before departing.**
 - **This tawaf does not require ihraam clothes or Sa'ee.**

The Messenger of Allah ﷺ used to take whatever ZamZam water he could because of the blessing therein. You can do the same (you will receive one at the airport as well).

Exiting the Masjid:

When you finish the Tawaaf, leave the Mosque like the rest of the people – do not leave walking backward – as you leave, put out your left foot first, saying:

**Bismillaahi was-salaatu was-salaamu'ala Rasoolillaahi,Allaahum-ma innee
as'aluka min fadhlika, Allaahumm a'simnee minash-shaitaanir-rajeem.**

بسم الله والصلاة والسلام على رسول الله، اللهم اني اسألك من فضلك، اللهم اعصمني من الشيطان الرجيم
O Allah, send blessings and peace upon Muhammad. O Allah, I ask You for Your bounty.

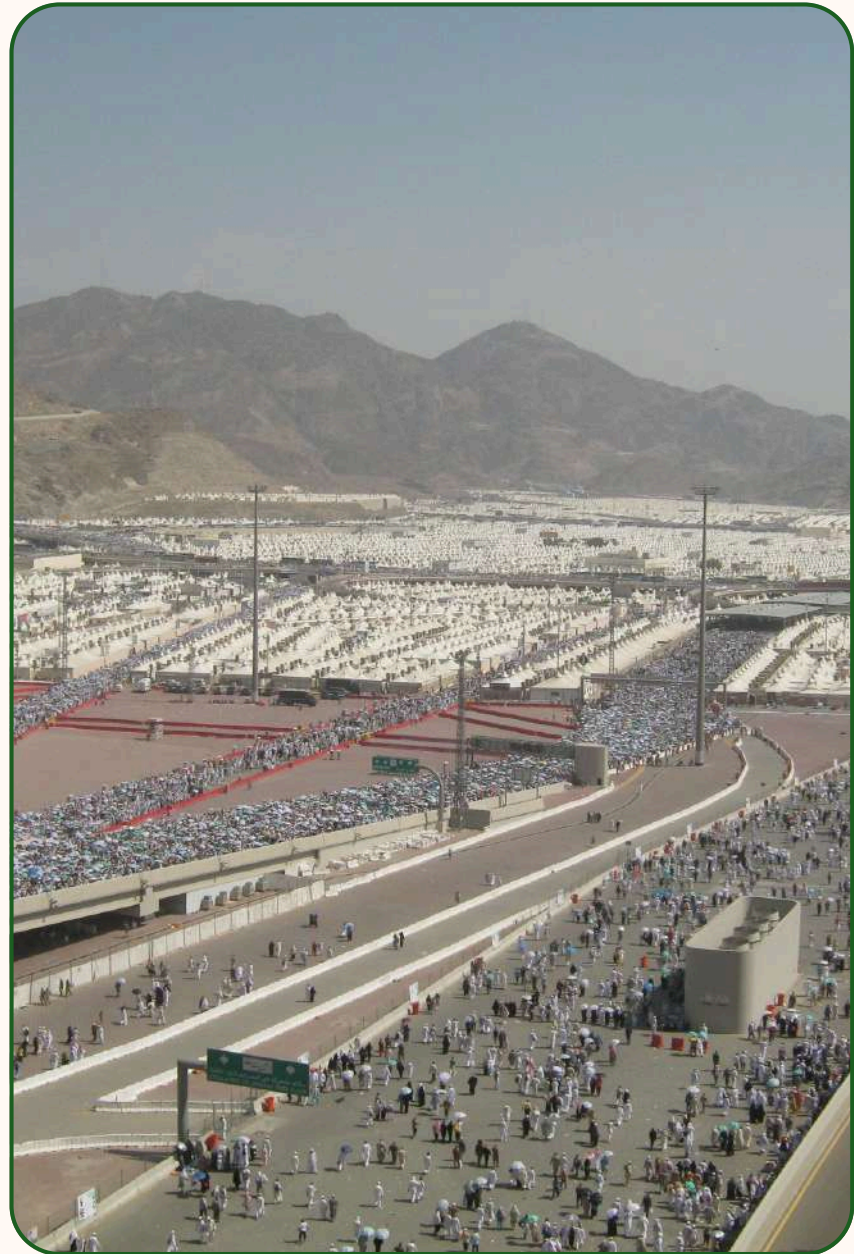
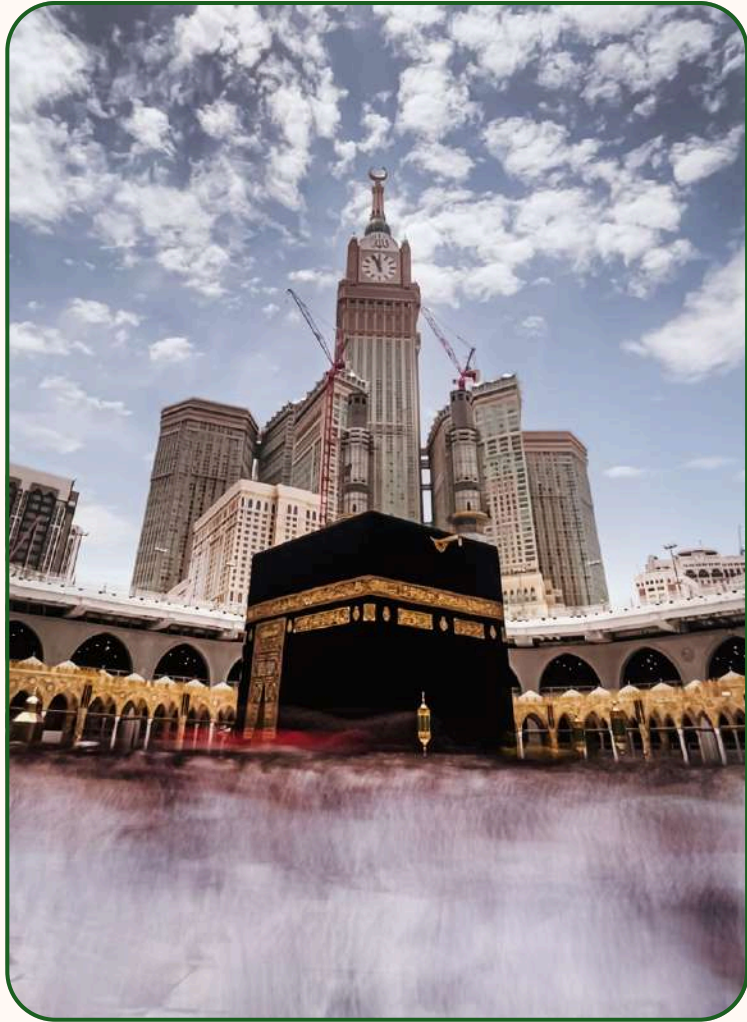
